Brazil's economy is 65% services, 30% industry and 5% agriculture

Brazil's natural resources include: wood, hydropower, iron ore and agriculture

A favela is a Brazilian slum. People have often constructed their own shelters to live in from the materials that they can find. People in the favelas are living below the poverty line (they do not have enough income to buy essential items like food).

Fairtrade ensures that workers have enough pay to have a good quality of life and that their working conditions are safe and suitable.
