

What is a biome?



A biome is a large region of Earth that has a similar climate (weather, temperature), animals and plants.

Vegetation belt is an area with certain plants based on the climate (weather,

temperature) and type of soil.

Biome **Features** Climate: hot and dry, Desert average temperature 38°C The Sahara during the day and -3.9°C at night, Animals: camels, meerkats Rainforest Climate: hot all year, 20°C to 25°C. The Amazon Animals: monkey, jaguars. **Climate**: cold and dry, **Tundra** – alpine and temperature is usually arctic between -40°C and 18°C Animals: polar bears, alpacas. Grassland -**Climate**: temperature between -20°c to 30°C temperate and depending on location tropical/savanna **Animals:** zebras, giraffes.
