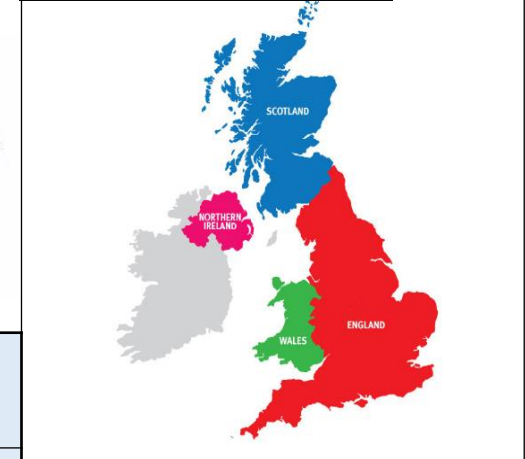
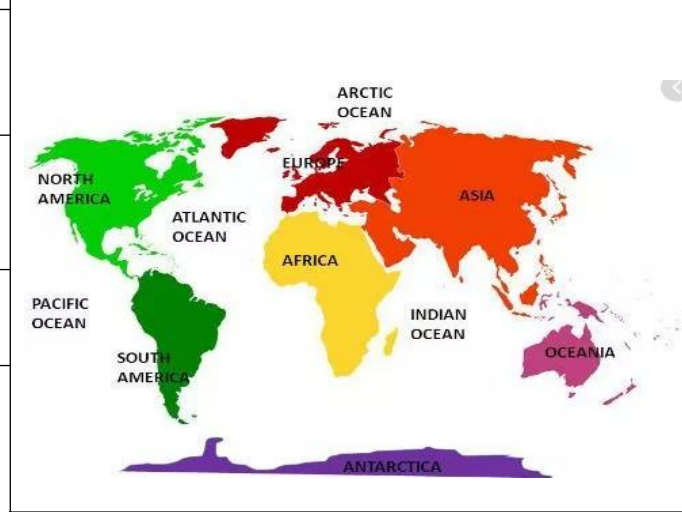


Year 1: Geography: What is the weather like where I live?



Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Weather	The weather includes the temperature outside, the wind direction and strength, as well as rain, cloud, snow and sun.
United Kingdom	The country in which we live. It is made up 4 countries; England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales.
Temperature	A measure of how hot or cold a place is. The temperature is higher towards the Equator and colder towards the North and South poles.
Countries	A place with a government. The United Kingdom is a country.
Equator	A line across the Earth , splitting in into a top and bottom. The top of the Earth is called the Northern Hemisphere and the bottom is called the Southern Hemisphere.
North Pole	A place at the very top of the Earth .
South Pole	A place at the very bottom of the Earth .
Globe	A round object showing the continents and oceans of planet Earth .
Map	A picture to represent an area of land or sea.
Earth	The planet on which we live.
Continents	Large areas of land that cover the Earth. Their names are Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica.



Sticky knowledge

- We live in the United Kingdom. The weather varies here across the four seasons (see Seasonal Change knowledge planner).
- The Earth is split into 2 hemispheres by the Equator. Countries close to the Equator are hot. As you move further away from the Equator, the temperature gets colder.
- The North and South poles are cold places.
- Weather patterns vary across the world.
