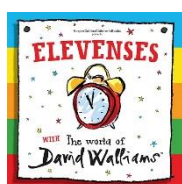

BBC Bitesize phonics – This has little videos for each sound and diagraph (2 letters that make a sound) in **phases 2 and 3** – which will be suitable for our reception children and children in years 1, 2 and 3 for revision. There are also phonics games and quizzes where our children can test their knowledge and have lots of fun whilst doing it!
