NSPCC Speak Out. Stay Safe online Programme

This was kick-started with an online assembly supervised by Mrs Marshall and Mrs Glassford which taught the children about abuse in all its forms and how to recognise the signs of abuse in a child-friendly way. This was followed up with a number of supporting classroom-based activities. As ever, the children were given a mission: Speak Out, Reach Out to a trusted adult if they are worried or concerned about something.

Next week, the children will receive a workshop to reinforce the messages in assembly this week.

Attendance

Our target for attendance is for children across the school to be present for 97% of the time. So far this academic year, our whole school attendance is at 95.5% - below our target.

This week, messages were sent out to parents of children whose attendance so far this year was below 95%. We know that there may be some extenuating circumstances, but we are obliged to make parents aware of their child's attendance and what could happen should their attendance not improve. The Local Authority can fine parents in some circumstances.

Attendance is very important. One morning away from class means missing English and Maths lessons which will not be repeated. This can result in gaps in learning which could mean your child struggling in future lessons.

Of course, there will be times when children are genuinely too ill to come to school, but if they have a general cough or cold, please think twice before keeping them at home. We will always send a child home who is too poorly to be in school.

Finally, a reminder that term time holidays cannot and will not be authorised in line with government guidelines and may result in a fine from the Local Authority.

Overall our attendance last week was 95.4%.

Mrs Taylor's class were the winners last week with 100%. This is a great achievement and we are very pleased.

On Tuesday, the Year 6 children enjoyed a fantastic trip to Beaumanor Hall for a World War 2 day. Dressed for the part, the children experienced what it was like to be an evacuee, working in a 1940s classroom, filling out identity cards and writing postcards to send home. They also took their ration cards to the grocery shop to buy some food for meals like Woolton pie, kidney stew and Spam and egg sandwiches - yum!

As well as this, they got to sit down in a bomb shelter and experience what it was like during the Blitz! Don't worry, we 'kept calm and carried on' by singing a few traditional '40s songs.

Finally, and most interestingly, the children tried out some code breaking in the actual cottage from which WW2 code breakers supported the effort to end the war. What an amazing experience!

This was a fantastic start to our WW2 unit: the children gained lots of practical experiences to link to their learning; we hope they will remember this trip for a long time.
