School Closure- Apologies for the closure of the school today.

It has been an exciting week this week with the launch of Happy Lunchtimes on the Junior Site! This started with an assembly on Monday, where Mrs Glassford explained to the junior children how lunchtimes would change and the activities which would now be available on the yard each day.

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (before the adverse weather conditions arrived), there was a new activity in *The Zone* for children to enjoy each day: we have had group skipping, skittles and a bean bag target game!
