Next week is Children's Mental Health Week and the theme is 'My Voice Matters'. My Voice Matters is about empowering young people to use their voices, share what matters to them, and encourage those around them to hear their voices.

To mark the week, we are inviting the **children to wear their own clothes on Monday 5th February** to celebrate our differences and to recognise the individuality of each child.

The week will begin with an assembly on both sites to raise awareness of how we can keep ourselves mentally healthy and we will look particularly at the power of kindness and prayer and how it can improve our physical and mental health. This will be followed up with daily activities in the classrooms about the Zones of Regulation which we introduced earlier in the year.

We will also be talking to the children about 'trusted adults' - the people they can turn to it times of worry, stress or crisis. We are looking forward to participating in this national project.
