Welcome

Christ the King is an Outstanding Catholic Primary School built on Gospel values. We put Christ and the teachings of the Catholic Church at the centre of everything we do and aspire for excellence for every child.

Christ the King is a larger than average primary school with 630 children across two sites. We have an Infant Site and a Junior Site which are approximately half a mile apart. We like to say, 'two sites, one school' because even though we are across two sites, there are lots of opportunities to come together as a school family.

Every child is valued as a unique individual made in the image and likeness of God. We provide creative, enriching experiences that enable children to develop a lifelong love of learning, a sense of personal responsibility and the skills and aspirations to meet the challenges of today and tomorrow.

Our school motto is Believe and Achieve! Our team want every child to meet their full academic potential but we also believe that Christ the King is a community of faith where our children encounter Christ and begin to form a personal relationship with God through the celebration of Mass, liturgy and prayer. We want our children to achieve academically, spiritually and morally.

We recognise and value the role of parents as the first teachers of their children and strive to develop a partnership between home and school.

Christ the King is currently assessed as Outstanding by OFSTED in all areas and as Outstanding by the Diocese of Nottingham for the provision of RE and collective worship.

Christ the King serves the families living and worshipping in the parishes of Blessed Sacrament, Mother of God and St Peter's in Leicester. We have an excellent relationship with our parishes and our children will expect to visit our churches and see our priests on a regular basis.

We are part of the St Thomas Aquinas Catholic Multi-Academy Trust, which is a network of twenty-three Catholic schools across Leicestershire and Rutland.

You are very welcome to visit Christ the King if you are considering an application for your child.

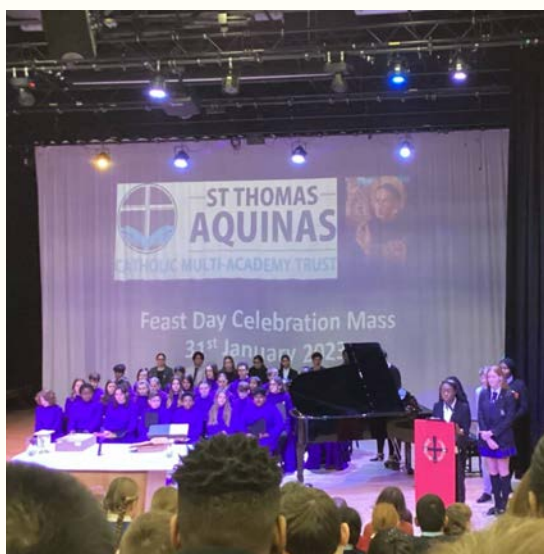

WRAPAROUND CARE

Breakfast Club runs from 7:45am each day on both the Infant Site and Junior Site at Christ the King Catholic Voluntary Academy.

After School Club is available until 5:45pm every day. After School Club is based at the Infant Site and is run by Christ the King staff. There is a walking bus, supervised by staff, to walk junior children to After School Club each day.

We have two seasonal uniforms:

Summer Uniform – after Easter holiday through to October half term holiday

- Navy v neck jumper or cardigan
- White short-sleeved polo shirt
- Grey/ black or white socks
- Grey shorts or trousers or dark blue gingham dress
- Sensible black flat shoes (No boots or trainers)

Winter Uniform – from after October half term until Easter holiday

- Navy knee length skirt or pinafore or mid-grey trousers
- Navy v neck jumper or cardigan
- Navy tights or grey, black or white socks
- White shirt with standard collar and school tie (navy and gold stripe)
- Sensible black flat shoes (No boots or trainers)



PE KIT



Children come into school wearing their P.E kit on the days they have P.E. All pupils need the following:

- Trainers
- White t-shirt (with or without the school badge)
- Navy shorts
- White socks
- Plain navy sweatshirt
- Plain navy jogging bottoms
- Plimsolls (optional for indoor PE)

JEWELLERY

In the interest of personal safety and security jewellery should not be worn in school.

If the child's ears are pierced, plain gold or silver studs may be worn but must be removed for P.E. classes. Children will not be permitted to wear other studs e.g. Nose studs. For safety reasons, children wearing inappropriate jewellery may be asked to remove it.

HAIR STYLES

Hair styles should be sensible. We do not permit extremes, e.g. closely shaven styles / patterns or coloured hair as these are not appropriate for primary-aged children and can often have an effect upon attitudes and behaviour. For health and safety reasons, we ask that all children with long hair have it tied up.

Christ the King Catholic Voluntary Academy believes that in order to facilitate teaching and learning, good attendance is essential. Pupils cannot achieve their full potential if they do not regularly attend school. Christ the King's school attendance target is 97%.

We are committed to:

- Ensuring parents follow the framework set in section 7 of the Education Act 1996.
- Promoting and modelling good attendance behaviour.
- Ensuring equality and fairness of treatment for all.
- Implementing our policies in accordance with the Equality Act 2010.
- Early intervention and working with other agencies to ensure the health and safety of our pupils.
- Rewarding regular attendance.

Each child's attendance can be summarised as:

97+% Excellent attendance: this will help all aspects of the child's progress and life in school

91-96% Average attendance: this is below target and requires improvement. The child's absence could now be affecting their attainment and progress at school. Please work with the school to implement intervention to help improve the situation.

90 or below 90%: Poor attendance: this will be affecting your child's attainment and progress and is disrupting their learning and social relationships in school. The child is now classed as a 'persistent absentee' and will be closely monitored by the Senior Leadership Team. The school will work with you to improve your child's attendance. Parents will be required to attend an attendance meeting with the Educational Welfare Officer.

If a child misses the start of the day they can miss work and do not spend time with their class teacher getting vital information and news for the day. Late arriving pupils also disrupt lessons, can be embarrassing for the child and can also encourage absence. Good time keeping is a vital life skill which will help our children as they progress through their school life and out into the wider world.

The school day starts at 8:25am for the Junior Site and 8:45am for the Infant Site. We expect our children to be in the playground before this time so that they are sitting at their desks ready to start the school day at 8.30am and 8:50 am.

Punctuality also applies to parents picking up children at the end of the day. The end of the school day is 3.00 pm for the Junior Site and 3.20pm for Infant Site.

Our staff are committed to providing a first-class Catholic education for all of our children. As a school we place a lot of importance on home-school links and very much value your support.

We have set up a number of different ways to provide good communication opportunities between home and school.

Christ the King uses Arbor, an information management system, to email and text parents correspondence; record the personal details of your child and your contact details; record attendance; take payments for school meals, Breakfast Club and After School Club; to book parents' evening appointments; as well as obtaining permissions and payments for offsite trips, visits and clubs.

The Arbor App can easily be downloaded to phones or accessed via logging in to the Parent Portal on computers or laptops.

Class Dojo is also an online platform Christ the King uses in addition to Arbor to provide latest news from the school office and your child's class teacher. Again, Class Dojo is an easily downloadable app.

Please do not hesitate to contact the school office if you require support with accessing either Arbor or Class Dojo and we will be happy to help.

OTHER METHODS OF COMMUNICATION INCLUDE:

- A weekly newsletter containing dates and information regarding school events. This will be shared on Class Dojo and published on the [school website](#).
- Regular updates and reminders for parents will be sent across Class Dojo and Arbor.
- Texts will be sent to parents for more urgent messages.
- You can also use your child's Reading Record book for day-to-day written communication. Please remind your child to show their book to the class teacher if you have put a note in it.
- Class Teachers will be available at the end of the day. If you have concerns or need to pass on some information, they will be more than happy to speak to you.
- You can make an appointment to speak to a class teacher/leader, either by phone or in person, by contacting the school office.

Admissions

The St Thomas Aquinas Catholic Multi Academy Trust is the admission authority for all the schools within the Trust and is responsible for determining the admissions policy. On behalf of the Trust, the admissions are coordinated by the relevant Local Authority. All decisions relating to admission applications will be taken by the school's Local Governing Body.

If applying for a place on faith grounds you will also need to complete a Supplementary Information Form and return this to the school office.

Parents whose children have not been offered a place at a school in the normal admissions round, for example for a Reception application, will be added to the school's waiting list unless they have been offered a place at a higher preference school. The waiting list will remain open until the end of the academic application year. If a parent wishes their child to remain on the waiting list, they must re-apply each academic year.

The CTK Way: Behaviour

At Christ the King one of our three pillars is 'Character Formation'. We recognise that in order to create a safe environment for all our pupils where they can maximise their learning, we must maintain the highest possible standards of pupil behaviour.

We have developed a curriculum for behaviour which we call 'The CTK Way'. The children at Christ the King are explicitly taught the rules and routines to ensure they are safe, happy and learn well.

We believe this helps to build the character of our pupils by supporting them to develop the habits and attitudes that will enable them to both succeed in our school and also later in their Christian lives.

We have five whole school rules:

- Always try your best
- Show respect
- Move calmly and quietly around school
- Dress to Impress
- Take care of one another and our things



At Christ the King, we see behaviour as a curriculum. Our school rules are explicitly taught and modelled to pupils.

The first week of the school year is devoted to teaching the children 'The CTK Way'. We explicitly teach and model the routines and school rules to all the children so that each routine becomes a habit. There will be continual reminders, reiteration and reinforcement from all staff at all times.

Christ the King staff will always seek to encourage good behaviour through positive reinforcement and rewards. Children's achievements are celebrated in a wide variety of ways at Christ the King. These include: positive feedback, house points, Star of the Week awards, CTK Mission Statement Awards, Lunchtime Teacher Awards, Hot Chocolate/Top Table with the Headteacher and the CTK Trophies.

The CTK Experience

We believe that Christ the King must provide more than just the opportunity to make outstanding academic progress. Therefore, we have introduced the CTK Experience as a formal structure to plan and deliver the exciting range of activities your child will access at the school.

The CTK Experience details the provision that every pupil will experience at CTK beyond the formal educational Curriculum. Most of us fondly remember the residential trips, sporting events and cultural experiences from our school days and the positive impact they can have... this is the CTK Experience.

The CTK Experience is designed to build on the experience of previous years and each Phase will see opportunities we think are best suited to your child's age and stage of development.

All of our children, regardless of their family circumstances, will access the CTK Experience during their time at the school. CTK aims to deliver the same academic opportunities to our children as they would receive at the best schools – the CTK Experience is the school's commitment to deliver the same level of opportunity outside of the classroom.

Our Catholic Faith is at the centre of the CTK Experience which is divided into 6 Key Areas:

- Catholic Life – Your child will have the opportunity to actively participate in the Catholic life of the school.
- Faith in Action – Your child will have the opportunity to put their Faith into action through charity work and fundraising.
- Visits, Trips and Retreats – Your child will have the opportunity to regularly visit places of interest outside of our school.
- Sports, Clubs and Activities – Your child will have the opportunity to learn new sports and hobbies.
- Performance, Culture and Creativity – Your child will have the opportunity to develop their creative and artistic talents.
- Missions, Vocations and Futures – Your child will have the opportunity to consider how they can use their God-given talents in their future careers.

Our Curriculum

The National Curriculum details the statutory objectives for the knowledge, skills and understanding that we teach at Christ the King from Year 1 to Year 6.

We have developed our curriculum over recent years to ensure we not only meet but exceed the requirements of the National Curriculum in providing our pupils with a knowledge-rich education to ensure their success as they move into KS3.

At Christ the King, we offer a broad, balanced and academically rigorous curriculum for all our learners.

Our curriculum is designed with knowledge at its heart to ensure that children develop a strong vocabulary base and understanding of the world. The curriculum promotes long-term learning and we believe that progress means knowing more and remembering more.



We have developed a curriculum built on current research regarding how memory works to ensure that children not only have access to 'the best that has been thought and said' but are taught this in a way that ensures children can remember the curriculum content in future years.

We make use of knowledge organisers (which are sent home regularly) to ensure children know exactly which information is expected to be learned over the course of their study in a particular subject.

One of the central aims of our curriculum is to ensure that our pupils are both “interesting and interested”. We want them to be ‘interesting’ to talk to, because they know a great deal about the world and ‘interested’ in finding out more.

We understand that knowledge is ‘sticky’, in other words, the more pupils know the easier it is for them to know more. This is why we place particular emphasis on children knowing by heart and building rich webs of knowledge as they progress through the curriculum.

Parents can support long-term learning through quizzing children on their knowledge organisers. We regularly run parent curriculum workshops which support parents in how they can help their children at home.

EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE (EYFS)

Our Early Years setting follows the statutory curriculum requirements as outlined in the latest version of the EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) statutory framework that applies from September 2021.

We offer a broad and balanced curriculum that covers statutory aspects as well as having identified the key knowledge and skills we feel our pupils need to acquire through the year to ensure that they are provided with the best possible start to their education.

Direct teaching is engaging, language rich and high quality. The skills taught in these sessions consistently provide enrichment opportunities to engage learning. We believe that childhood should be a happy, investigative and enquiring time in our lives, where there are no limits to curiosity and there is a thirst for new experiences and knowledge. The knowledge and skills that are taught are carefully planned to support children in practising them during child initiated and directed play.
