1st place: Miss Laycock and Mrs Gibson's class with 100%


2nd Place: Miss O'Brien, Mrs Connell/Mrs Valente's and Mrs Morris' class with 99.0%


3rd Place: Mrs Darby's class with 98.7%

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Christ the King will be taking part in The Big Walk and Wheel challenge during March 2024. We are encouraging children to cycle or scoot to school as part of a national event and competition.


Each day, children will be asked to record if they walked, wheeled, scooted or cycled to school to contribute to our whole school score.
