This type of popular music is known as jazz music. Jazz music originated from the African American communities of New Orleans, USA in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. 'Take the 'A' Train' became the signature piece for the Duke Ellington Orchestra which is known as one of the greatest jazz bands of all time.

There are many instruments used in jazz music which include the piano, saxophone, trumpet, drums, trombone and cello.

Vocabulary		
Swing	Swing music is a style of jazz music that has a medium tempo. It creates smooth sounds for easy-listening by using simple chords.	
Blues	Blues music is characterised by 'sad melodies'. The expression 'having the blues' means you feel gloomy and early blues music was slow and emotional using simple harmonies.	
Chords	Three or more single pitches heard simultaneously.	
Call and Response	A technique where one musician offers a phrase and a second player answers with a direct commentary or response to the offered phrase.	
Improvisation	This means creating a musical composition on the spot. This could be by yourself or with others.
