THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

(7 June) On this day we remember how much Jesus loves us all.

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

(26 June) Today we celebrate our belief in the Trinity, the three persons of God: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

SS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

(29 June) We celebrate the lives of these important saints who helped establish the Christian Church.

As we return to school after Easter, the Church is still celebrating this great event. The focus of this term's work in Religious Education is the role the Holy Spirit plays in our lives.
