candle		The Baptismal candle is lit from the Easter candle. The parents are given this candle so they will help their child follow the light of Christ.
chrism		The priest anoints the baby with the oil of chrism. It represents that the baby has been made holy.
font		The font holds the holy water which is used in Baptism. It symbolises the River Jordan, where Jesus was baptised.
garment		The parents wrap a white garment around the baby. It represents purity (sins have been washed away).
