Advent is a time when Christians prepare to receive that love and friendship given in Jesus at Christmas. They do this by listening to or reading passages from the Bible, singing songs and hymns and saying special prayers which help them think about God's gift of love and friendship given to us in Jesus. Isaiah, a prophet from the Old Testament, who was waiting for the coming of the Messiah, the one promised by God who would show God's love and bring peace. For centuries, the people of God longed for and waited in hope for the coming of the Saviour. This was especially true when there were difficulties and the people were treated badly. Three men from faraway lands came to visit Jesus when he was born. They brought gifts. Gold – to symbolise that he was a king Frankincense – to symbolise his holiness Myrrh - to symbolise his early death
