Attendance

We take pride in our attendance at CTK and want to share this with you.

Last year our attendance was 96.5%. The school's target is 97%. If we become concerned about your child's attendance then you will receive an email or a letter to inform you that we will be monitoring it closely as a school.

If your child is absent from school, please remember that you must phone the school daily to report the absence unless advised otherwise.

We understand that there are times when absence from school is unavoidable, and we always aim to approach each family's circumstances with understanding and compassion. However, we must also continue to follow national guidance set by the Department for Education, which does not permit the authorisation of holidays or other requests for leave of absence during term time, except in exceptional circumstances. While we appreciate the value of family time, it is important to balance this with the need for consistent and uninterrupted learning.

Please see the link [here](#) for further guidance, which outlines the legal framework around school attendance. This includes important details regarding the issuing of penalty notices and, in cases of repeated, prolonged unauthorised absence, the possibility of legal prosecution. While these measures are always a last resort, they are part of the statutory responsibilities placed on schools and local authorities.

Parent Curriculum Meetings

Over the next month, parents will be invited into school for a parent introduction meeting. The purpose of these meetings will be to:

- Meet your child's class teacher
- Visit your child's classroom
- Find out about the statutory tests they may be taking
- Learn about trips, visits, and extra-curricular learning as part of the CTK Experience
- Find out how you can support your child at home with their learning
- Find out key information about school life at CTK

REMINDER - Arbor

Please can all parents make sure they have set up their account on Arbor and have downloaded the App. This is the primary method of communication and payment this academic year. You can register, book and pay for any event in school. Examples include: clubs, trips, dinners, parents' evening, breakfast club and afterschool club. Please speak to the school office if you are have any problems or questions and they will be happy to help.



Uniform

In line with our Behaviour Policy, we are asking all children to 'Dress to Impress!' Children should aim to look smart at all times. All children will be expected to wear full school uniform and to wear it well... shirts should be tucked in, schools shoes must be worn, no boots or trainers etc. Nails should not be painted and hair should be tied back. On PE days, children should attend school wearing a white polo t-shirt, navy shorts, a plain navy tracksuit and trainers.

We want the children to feel proud to wear the uniform of Christ the King and to have high expectations of their own appearance, making them excellent ambassadors for the school. I would ask you to support us with this and to encourage your child to look smart every day. Please see the website detailing the school uniform requirements at CTK

Please note - parents are not required to buy any branded uniform items unless they wish to. To make school uniform as affordable as possible for our families, we now sell iron-on school badges for £2.50. These can be purchased via the Arbor Shop and can be attached to any item of clothing.

Collection Forms

A polite reminder to all parents to return the collection form to school. We will only dismiss children to the named persons on the collection sheet. The parent or carer must notify the school office if there are any changes to these arrangements before 2.30pm to avoid any delays at the end of the school day.

If you are happy for your child to walk to meet you or to walk home independently, you will need to give written permission. Thank you for your support.
