



Sports Premium Spending Plan

Funding to support Primary PE and School Sport

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Our school has been allocated £21,380 for the academic year 2025-2026.

We will prioritise our PE and sport premium to improve in the following 5 key areas:

- 1: Increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport.
- 2: Increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport.
- 3: Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement.
- 4: Offering a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils.
- 5: Increase participation in competitive sport.

Nature of Support:

1. Employment of specialist PE coach to deliver:

- Professional Development: Work alongside teaching staff to upskill and build their confidence in delivering high-quality, engaging PE lessons.
- Enrichment and Opportunities: Lead and coordinate sports trips, tournaments, and inter-school events to broaden pupils' sporting experiences.
- Targeted Support: Plan and deliver focused intervention programs for identified children to improve physical development and confidence.

Est Cost: £15,004

Intended Impact

Teaching staff to observe and deliver with sports coach leading lessons. In addition, whole-class assessment framework will be introduced to support consistent monitoring and recording of pupil progress across all fundamental movement skills. This will further embed the school's PE curriculum and long-term aims and ensure full coverage and compliance with the National Curriculum requirements. Sports coach to lead on delivery of sports trips and sporting competitions across the school.

2. Purchasing 12-month subscription of realPE scheme of work.

Est Cost: £695.00

Intended Impact

Renewing this PE scheme enables teaching staff and sports coaches to further develop their confidence, having benefited from using the same programme consistently over a number of years.

3. Continuation of the Healthy Schools Network partnership for 2025/2026.

Est Cost: £350.00

Intended Impact

The Healthy Schools Network has been running in Leicester since 2016 and has grown over the years offering a variety of initiatives and support for Leicester City Schools in Health and Wellbeing. The four key strands the network cover are Physical Activity, Healthy Eating, PSHCE and SEMH. By continuing to sign up to this network and gain access to a number of opportunities from attending conferences and network meetings hearing from professionals in the sector, accessing a self-assessment tool to support for further development of our school's award status from Silver to Gold by 2027.

4. 'Going for Gold'. All pupils to be given the opportunity to try a new and exciting sport.

Est Cost: £2,500.00

Intended Impact

To broaden pupils' sporting experiences by introducing them to new and exciting activities beyond the traditional school curriculum. This initiative aims to engage all pupils in unique and challenging sports such as ice skating and fencing to give enjoyment, confidence, and hopefully lifelong participation in physical activity.

5. Equipment purchases for both school sites for PE lessons and lunchtime activities.

Est Cost: £1,000

Intended Impact

To enhance children's enjoyment and participation in sports by providing modern, age-appropriate equipment across both sites. This will ensure that all children have access to up-to-date resources that support skill development, safety, and fun during physical activities.

6. Support towards cost of travel to and from sporting events and competitions.

Est Cost: £1,000.

Intended Impact

Providing financial support for travel will enable more children to participate in events, particularly those from low-income backgrounds and allow the school to be able to enter more events than in previous years.

7. Provide top-up swimming lessons for Year 6 pupils who cannot yet reach 25 meters.

Est Cost: £800.00

Intended Impact

To increase the number of Year 6's pupils achieving the government target of being able to swim 25m or perform a 'self-rescue' by the end of Year 6.

Estimated total spend: £21, 349.00
